What are DARE UK Community Groups?



• Modelled on the <u>Research Data Alliance</u> community groups: open invitation for people to submit proposals for community groups that align with the DARE UK vision and objectives

Common, specific purpose

Code of Conduct



Clear rules and expectations

Identifiable, motivated leadership for community coordination

About these funding opportunities



DARE UK Interest Group call:

- Funds of up to £60,000 are now being made available for bootstrapping new or maintaining existing Interest Groups, over a 14-month period from Feb 2025 – end of March 2026.
- Could be requested for activities such as the following:
 - Salaries and overheads for community management, coordination, and administration.
 - Workshops, conferences and events, including venue hire, travel, and subsistence.
 - Support for communications and engagement activities for monitoring and dissemination of community group outputs, including website development and maintenance and software licenses.

DARE UK Working Group call:

- Funds of up to £75,000 are now being made available for Working Groups, over a 12-month period from Feb 2025 – end of Jan 2026.
- Could be requested for the same activities as described above for Interest Groups, but with the addition of:
 - Salaries and overheads for Working Group members' time to develop and produce the Working Groups outputs







What we are looking for



- Interest and Working Groups that bring together a diverse and inclusive network of researchers and other relevant stakeholders to achieve their goals, aligned to the DARE UK vision, through partnership working
 - DARE UK is about enhancing sensitive data infrastructure for research in the public good: (see <u>DARE UK Phase 1 Recommendations</u> to understand the broad challenge areas the programme is interested in)
- We are particularly interested in funding applications that support partnerships working to address needs in areas including **but not limited to** the following:
 - Technology/tool evaluation and comparisons in the (semi)-automation of Trusted Research Environment (TRE) operations
 - Reviews and recommendations of data standards
 - Reviews and recommendations of governance models
 - Reviews of and recommendations of cost-recovery and other funding models for TREs
 - Defining effective public engagement strategies around building and running secure trustworthy infrastructure and conducting open, transparent research using sensitive







How to apply



- New Interest Groups and Working Groups:
 - Complete an Interest Group charter or Working Group charter
 - o Covers the 'why', 'what', 'how' and 'who' of the group
 - Complete a funding application form
 - Sets out planned Interest/Working Group outcomes/outputs requiring funding, and approach to achieving these
 - Applicant and team capability to deliver
 - Project plan
 - Resources and cost justification
- Existing Interest Groups:
 - submit a funding application form only (although updates to existing charters are welcome)
 - The deadline for submission is 6pm Tuesday 19 November 2024 by email to enquiries@dareuk.org.uk with contracts@hdruk.org.uk in cc.







How your application will be assessed



Interest Group/Working Group charter:

For your community group to be endorsed, the group needs to:

- Align with the DARE UK programme's overall vision and objectives (see <u>DARE UK Phase 1</u>
 <u>Recommendations</u> to understand the broad challenge areas the programme is interested in) and:
 - Typically national scale (although can be local if the work is clearly scalable)
 - Cross-domain/data domain agnostic
- Do not duplicate work being carried out elsewhere

Funding application forms:

Look carefully at the 'Assessor questions' in the funding application form and the scoring criteria to understand the criteria the panel will use to assess the application

- In addition, proposals for new Working Groups must also include plans to undertake other kinds of PIE activities, such as:
 - workshops and focus groups with members of the public to seek public input into the Working Group's output(s)
 - input of public contributors to review Working Group descriptions and outputs







Expectations on public involvement and engagement



- Inclusion in Interest Group and Working Group governance and decision-making:
 - Plans for at least one public contributor to take part as a Community Group co-chair.
- In addition, proposals for new Working Groups must also include plans to undertake other kinds of PIE activities, such as:
 - workshops and focus groups with members of the public to seek public input into the Working Group's output(s)
 - input of public contributors to review Working Group descriptions and outputs
- PIE plans should be clearly embedded into project timelines and fully costed into project proposals.
- There is no upper limit for the proportion of the award that can be dedicated to public involvement and engagement, with a typical expectation of ~10% allocation to PIE, depending on the nature of the work being undertaken.









